### Certificate course on the policies and practices of environmental management in India

**June 4 – August 2, 2008 New Delhi**

You have 9 weeks to explore the complexities underlying the environment-development debate in India. Lectures. Readings. Presentations. Occasions to debate, deliberate, appear before an audience. Time to read, or report. Watch a film, and review it. Attend seminars, interrogate the guest speakers, eminent activists and policy makers. We want you in the classroom, and out of it too.

You will learn about:

- *Managing natural resources today*
- *Urban growth and its challenges*
- *Sustainable industrialisation*
- *Poverty and the biomass economy*
- *Global environment negotiations: focus on climate change.*
- *Challenges of environmental governance*

**Eligibility:** A total of 35 participants will be selected. The course is open to young professionals and college students from any stream. Applicant must submit a 500-word essay on any one of the following topics:

- *Environment vs development: two sides of the same coin?*
- *The tiger, the Nano and the 'common man': will all three thrive in India circa 2050 AD?*

**The essay must reach CSE latest by May 4, 2008, together with a résumé / CV.**

**Course fee:** Rs 15,000. The fee includes all field excursions, reading materials, lunch and refreshments during training days. **The fee does not cover accommodation or meals.** We can help outstation participants with accommodation, on request.

Cheque or Bank Draft in the name "Centre for Science and Environment". Please add Rs 15 for all non-Delhi cheques.

**KAMLA CHOWDHRY FELLOWSHIPS:** Will be awarded to select candidates on the basis of their performance in the entrance essay. The fellowship will be of Rs 12,000 each. Additional stipends are available for outstation (non-Delhi) candidates to cover some of their stay costs.

The Fellowship programme is supported by an endowment from the late Dr Kamla Chowdhry, a distinguished academic and an ardent Gandhian, whose interests spanned forestry, ecology, environment, women's issues and people's participation.
